食物環境衛生署為市民提供骨灰安置服務，轄下八個公眾骨灰安置所位於：哥連臣角、鑽石山、富山、葵涌、和合石、長洲、南丫島及坪洲。

如市民曾獲配售公眾骨灰龕位安放先人骨灰，可申請於該公眾骨灰龕位加放骨灰。

食物環境衛生署已於2014年1月撤銷公眾骨灰龕位安放先人骨灰的數目上限。

經申請並獲批核後，與首位先人有近親或密切關係的先人，其骨灰可安放於同一個公眾骨灰龕位。



The Food and Environmental Hygiene Department provides columbarium services to the public. Its eight columbaria are located in Cape Collinson, Diamond Hill, Fu Shan, Kwai Chung, Wo Hop Shek, Cheung Chau, Lamma Island and Peng Chau.

For people who have been allocated a public niche for depositing the cremated ashes of their lost loved ones, they may apply for placing additional cremated ashes into the public niche.

The Food and Environmental Hygiene Department has since January 2014 removed the cap on the number of sets of cremated ashes that may be placed in a public niche.

Subject to application and approval obtained, the cremated ashes of the deceased person can be placed in a public niche if the subsequent deceased was in close relationship with or was a close relative of the first deceased.
