## Question:

Regarding the law enforcement work against dripping air-conditioners,

- 1. please set out the number of complaints received, the investigation work, the Nuisance Notices issued, as well as the number of prosecutions and convictions in relation to dripping air-conditioners in the past 3 years, with a breakdown by District Council district; and
- 2. what were the staff establishment, actual manpower and relevant expenditure for handling the related law enforcement work in the past 3 years?

## Reply:

- 1. A breakdown of the information by the 18 District Council districts is provided in Annex.
- 2. Under the staff establishment of the Food and Environmental Hygiene Department in each of the past 3 years (2022-23, 2023-24 and 2024-25), 337 Health Inspectors are deployed to 19 District Environmental Hygiene Offices (DEHOs) across the territory. They undertake various environmental hygiene duties, including handling complaints against dripping from air-conditioners. The nuisances caused by dripping air-conditioners happen mainly in summer. To cope with the substantial increase in workload during that period of time, the Department has recruited contract staff and set up dedicated teams since 2017 to step up inspection, advising and education, and has taken law enforcement actions targeting buildings where the problem of dripping air-conditioners is serious. The number of contract staff and the salary costs for the teams are as follows:
