Question:

Regarding the prosecution against littering, please advise this Committee of:

- 1. the number of complaints received by the Food and Environmental Hygiene Department, the number of prosecutions instituted and penalties involved in the past 3 years, with a breakdown by year and the 18 administrative districts;
- 2. the number of proactive enforcement actions taken by the Department, the personnel mobilised and their effectiveness in the past 3 years, with a breakdown by year and the 18 administrative districts; and
- 3. the details of community education and publicity work conducted by the Department in the past 3 years, with a breakdown by year and the 18 administrative districts.

Reply:

1&2. The number of complaints against littering received by the Food and Environmental Hygiene Department, the number of fixed penalty notices (FPNs) issued, the number of prosecutions instituted and the number of law enforcement officers involved in the past 3 years (2022 to 2024), with a breakdown by District Council district, are set out in Annex. In the court cases convicted for littering, the penalties imposed ranged from \$300 to \$10,000. The Department does not keep a separate breakdown of the proactive enforcement actions or follow-up actions on complaints.

According to the records, the Department issued 31 945 FPNs in 2024, a reduction of about 24% as compared with 2023. It was estimated that with the increase of fixed penalty against littering in October 2023, coupled with the enforcement actions by the Department, the deterrent effect against littering has been effectively enhanced.

3. Apart from taking enforcement actions, the Department has adopted various measures to promote environmental hygiene, including publicity and health education, community participation and enhanced cleansing services. For publicity and health education in the community, the Department raises the public awareness of environmental hygiene through various channels, including the issue of press releases,

Facebook and Instagram pages of "Keep Clean Ambassador Ah Tak", Announcements in the Public Interest on television and radio, as well as display of posters and banners at government venues (such as public markets and public toilets) and public transport facilities (such as MTR stations and bus stops).

Moreover, the Health Education Exhibition and Resource Centre of the Department at Kowloon Park in Tsim Sha Tsui promotes environmental hygiene and food safety related information to the public, schools as well as centres and homes for the elderly through various hygiene education activities. The Department has a publicity vehicle which serves as a mobile education centre for making visits to schools, housing estates and public parks. Through different media and with an innovative and educational approach, it provides the public with knowledge about food, personal and environmental hygiene. The Department does not keep a separate breakdown of the community education and publicity work by year and District Council district.
