Question:

It has been reported that many members of the public have brought regulated food into Hong Kong from the Mainland or overseas illegally, and there have even been activities of cross-boundary purchase of such food by agents. In this connection, please advise this Committee of:

1. the number of cases of members of the public bringing regulated food into Hong Kong illegally in each month of the past 2 years and, among them, the number of cases in which prosecutions were instituted.

Reply:

1. Regarding inbound persons illegally bringing regulated food into Hong Kong, the number of non-compliance cases referred by the Customs and Excise Department to the Centre for Food Safety (CFS) of the Food and Environmental Hygiene Department, as well as the number of prosecutions instituted by CFS under the Imported Game, Meat, Poultry and Eggs Regulations (Cap. 132AK) in the past 2 years (i.e. 2023 and 2024) are set out below:
