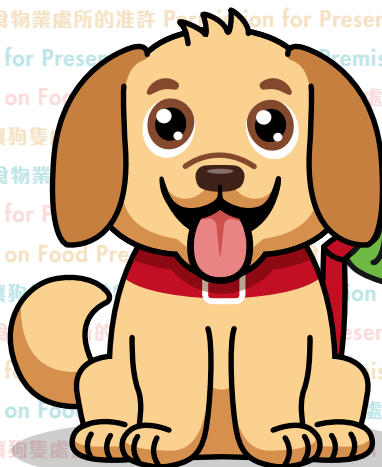

Guidelines on Good Practices and Behaviour for Dog-Friendly Restaurants

• Mutual Respect • Harmony with Pets •

In response to public demand as well as to promote human-pet harmony and create new business opportunities for the catering industry, the Government has introduced a new initiative in mid-2026 under which restaurant operators may apply for permission to allow the entry of dogs to their food premises. Food premises permitted to admit dogs (permitted restaurants) must display, at all times and at a conspicuous place at the entrance, signage in the designated format so that members of the public may choose whether to patronise them.

With the aim of ensuring food safety and public environmental hygiene, and protecting the safety of human and animals, the Government regulates customers bringing dogs and permitted restaurants through legislation and licensing conditions. Moreover, the Food and Environmental Hygiene Department (FEHD) has compiled a set of Guidelines on Good Practices and Behaviour (the Guidelines) for reference of restaurant operators and customers, with a view to striking an optimal balance between effective regulation and operational flexibility.

The Guidelines are divided into three parts: The first part is for reference of restaurant operators in devising operational arrangements and house rules; the second part sets out the best practices for customers bringing dogs to control their dogs in permitted restaurants; and the third part offers recommendations for other diners interacting with the dogs so as to promote mutual respect and understanding.
