Ching Chung Sian Yuan's <u>Licence Application</u>

"Approval-in-principle for Licence Application"

Based on the documents submitted by the applicant so far, the Private Columbaria Licensing Board (the Licensing Board) is of the view that this application for licence is basically in compliance with the application requirements for licence except that the applicant still needs to take further actions and submit revised documents related to building, land, environmental protection and proposed plans.

When the applicant has fulfilled all the requirements, the Private Columbaria Affairs Office (PCAO) will submit the licence application to the Licensing Board for determination. This "approval-in-principle for licence application" is valid for one year. If the applicant has not fulfilled all requirements and notified the Licensing Board (c/o PCAO) in writing of its compliance with those requirements within one year from the giving of this "approval-in-principle for licence application", the Licensing Board will re-examine this licence application.

If the applicant still fails to comply with all the requirements for this licence application and notify the Licensing Board (c/o the PCAO) in writing by 24 May 2024, the Licensing Board will re-examine the licence application.
